

Citizens Against Domestic Violence, Inc Privacy Policy

Introduction

This privacy policy describes how Citizens Against Domestic Violence, Inc collects, uses, and shares your personal information in connection with non-consumer (A2P) messages. We are committed to protecting your privacy and will only collect and use your information in ways that are consistent with this policy and the CTIA best practices.

Collection of Personal Information

We collect personal information about you when you:

- Provide your phone number to us
- Opt in to receive A2P messages from us

The personal information we collect may include your name, phone number, and other information that is relevant to the purpose of the A2P message.

Use of Personal Information

We use your personal information for the following purposes:

- To send you A2P messages
- To measure the effectiveness of our A2P messages
- To improve our A2P messages
- To prevent fraud and abuse

Sharing of Personal Information

We may share your personal information with third-parties in the following circumstances:

- With service providers who help us send A2P messages
- With analytics providers who help us measure the effectiveness of our A2P messages
- In response to a legal request, such as a subpoena or court order
- To protect our rights or property

Opting Out of A2P Messages

You can opt out of receiving A2P messages from us at any time by replying STOP to any A2P message we send you.

Your Rights

You have the right to access, correct, delete, or restrict the use of your personal information. You also have the right to object to the processing of your personal information and to have your personal information transferred to another organization.
